### GSHPA Kicks Off 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with Honorary Committee Luncheon at Governor's Residence

Leaders from Pennsylvania's three Girl Scout councils gathered on Friday, March 2 at the Governor's residence in Harrisburg to kick off Girl Scouts' centennial celebration throughout the state. The luncheon was attended by members of each council and also by members of the Pennsylvania Girl Scouts 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Honorary Committee.

The committee, led by honorary chair, Susan Corbett, First Lady of Pennsylvania, is made up of university presidents, prominent physicians, corporate executives, judges, community thought leaders and activists from all across the state, and 77% of its members are former Girl Scouts.

The luncheon opened with a flag ceremony performed by Girl Scouts from troops 10840 and 10795 from Harrisburg and an introduction by Girl Scouts in the Heart of Pennsylvania's President and CEO, Jane Ransom. "100 years ago this month, Girl Scouts was founded, and we're thrilled to come together at this historic moment to officially kick off our centennial

come together at this historic moment to officially kick off our centennial celebration," Ransom said.

"One of the first things I was asked to do after moving into the Governor's residence a little over a year ago was to become the Honorary Chair of this committee of influential women from across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania," Mrs. Corbett stated during her opening remarks. "I agreed immediately because I have such fond memories of being a troop leader and have seen first-hand what Girl Scouts does for girls."

During the luncheon, committee members heard from leaders of each Girl Scout council and learned about the impact of Girl Scouts across the state, and also how Girl Scouts is evolving to meet the needs of today's girls.

Members of the committee were briefed on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary events and celebrations in each council throughout the state. They were asked to use their influence to shine the spotlight on Girl Scouting in their communities.

"We look forward to beginning our next 100 years by continuing to provide a forum for girls that allows them to be who they are, encourages them to accomplish anything they want to do, and helps today's girls become tomorrow's leaders," Ransom added.


