Cookie College 2011: An Introduction to the Business World Done Girl Scout Style!

This month, the GSHPA spotlight shines on Cookie College 2011. As we all know, the Girl Scout Cookie Sale is underway, as initial order taking began on Monday, Jan. 3. To help kickoff cookie sale season, more than 200 girls from across our council registered for the second annual GSHPA Cookie College. Now a new batch of CEOs is open for business in the GSHPA Council. The second annual GSHPA "Cookie College" was a huge success with girls in grades 6 through 12

graduating as Cookie Entrepreneur Officers.

The event was held Saturday, Jan. 8, at Penn State Harrisburg. Girls attended three interactive workshops focusing on goal setting, social media and marketing tactics. They were encouraged to launch their very own cookie business, not only to help raise money, but to help them understand skills they will use as young women entering the business world.

"Cookie College is a great event for our girls, not only to get them excited about kicking off cookie sale season and our cookie program, but also to really show them more about how participating in the cookie sale will help them later on with developing different business skills," said GSHPA Executive Vice President, Ann Goropoulos.

strong foundation to help them achieve their dreams. ABC27 news anchor Valerie Pritchett, a former top Girl Scout cookie seller, spoke at the event and answered questions from girls on how her experiences helped shape her success.

"This was the second year for Cookie College, and it was even more successful than last year," said GSHPA Director of Product Sales and Retail, Emily Honafius. "They were especially excited to meet a local celebrity like Valerie Pritchett, and the best part is that she was once a girl scout herself!"

The Girl Scout Cookie Program is much more than a way to help troops raise money. It is a hands-on leadership and entrepreneurial program unlike any other in the world. Girls gain a wealth of essential skills, not from a book, but from real-life experiences that build a strong foundation for success.

Around the Council

Girl Highlights

- Daisy Troop #50772 recently collected bags of clothing to be distributed through the Newfoundland Food Bank. The girls collected 14 bags as part of a program in which a local company gave a matching number of turkeys to the food bank.
- Daisy Troop #31210 colored ribbons and sent the pictures to soldiers at Fort Leonard Wood. See photo below:



- Ambassador Girl Scout, Jamie Bohenick of Troop #12270 engaged a group of 20 senior citizens at Frey Senior Village in Middletown as part of her Gold Award Project: How Dogs Change Lives from Girl Scouts to Grandparents. Jamie and her Susquehanna Service Display Dog, November, gave a very enjoyable presentation on how Service Dogs assist their human partners. Jamie has been presenting at several Senior Residential facilities.
- Troop #60008 had an eye opening experience when they went to paint pumpkins with the residents of the Mansion Nursing Home, in the Sunbury area. One of the troop members is deaf and has to sign when she speaks. While she was signing to her friends a nursing home resident oversaw her and got very excited because he too was deaf and not many people take their time to communicate with him. He and the Jr. hit it off right away and had a signing good time. They are planning more trips back to the Mansion.
- Troop #61115 helped with the Feed a Friend program at the Food Bank in Milton. WNEP TV filmed the girls as they helped bag food distribution to those in need. See photo below:
- As part of the Spread the Bread project, members of Troop # 10554 along with their family and friends recently baked 164 loaves of bread for Carlisle area non-profits such as Carlisle CARES, Safe Harbor, and the Salvation Army. In addition to baking many of these loaves of bread, the girls were involved in

delivering the bread to the agencies so that they could visit with some of those whom they might impact. See photo below:



Volunteer Highlights

- Service Unit 437 took advantage of the break over the holidays to enjoy a winter weekend at Camp Golden Pond. Five troops (ranging from Brownie through Senior Girl Scouts) worked on Try-Its, Badges, and IPs in addition to hiking snow covered trails, enjoying wood fires, and experiencing nature in all its winter beauty.
- Volunteers in Service Unit 172 (Dauphin County) recently planned a Toymaker Badge workshop. They planned for the girls to make toys, including furnished doll houses, puzzles, portable Tic Tac Toe games, and paper dolls and clothing. Every girl who attends is to bring a toy for a local toy drive.
- When nobody in Service Unit 839 Gettys-Trefoil had come forward to direct day camp by the November Service Unit meeting, leaders were told that meant there would be no day camp next summer. After the meeting, one of the leaders told her daughter the news, and she responded that would have to run it themselves, because the experience is too important for girls to miss. Her daughter was a Program Aide throughout her teen Girl Scout years and is excited that now, as an adult, she gets to be the director of SU839's 2011 Day Camp.

Preparation for Transition to New Girl Scout Materials Underway

Girl Scouts of the USA is in the process of introducing new and revised program resources, with the goal of a Movement-wide transition to the new resources by September 2012.

The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting, the new badge and handbook series, will be available for purchase beginning fall 2011. All other Girl Scout books and resources will gradually be retired. Until that time, all Girl Scout products are available and should continue to be used until supplies last.

The transition to The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting does mean that a line of new badges will be introduced and a selection of out-dated badges will be retired. The new badges will combine contemporary topics of interest to girls and long-time favorite activities. Despite some of the rumors, badges are definitely here to stay and continue to give girls topic- specific skill-building activities. In preparation for this transition, the following badges will continue to be available through the Council store while supplies last. If your troop is either in the midst of or considering working on one or more of the following badges, please contact the Council Store by calling 1-877-920-1951 to check on the availability of the badge.
