There's Still Time to Apply for Your Forever Green Service Unit Mini Grants!

Service units who are interested in organizing an environmentally themed project or event as part of the Forever Green Signature Programming initiative are invited to apply for a mini-grant. Qualified applications must be able to demonstrate how their project or event will help Girl Scouts in the Heart of Pennsylvania raise environmental awareness among girls and the communities we serve while also helping to reduce our overall carbon footprint.

All projects or events must take place between October 1, 2011 and September 30, 2012, but the deadline to apply is March 1, 2011. If approved, grant recipients will receive \$200 - \$500 to be used towards this project or event. Click here to check-out the guidelines and application.

Troop Adventure Camp Returns This Spring!

Attention all troop leaders - Interested in taking your troop camping but still haven't had time to complete the required training to do so? Wish you could provide your troop with an outdoor experience that will create the kinds of memories that will last a lifetime, but camping just isn't your cup of tea? No worries, we have the perfect win-win solution – Troop Adventure Camp (TAC)!

Based on feedback from past Troop Adventure Camps, we've tried to put together the kind of troop camping experience that even the most novice troop leader and her troop can enjoy. This year, Troop Adventure Camp will occur throughout the council. TAC will be geared towards specific grade levels and will include themed activities on a number of dates at all seven of our camp properties. Troops will have the opportunity to participate in a pre planned schedule of activities. Essentially, troops will arrive the night before the program begins and stay in a lodge, cabin or tent unit. During the onsite registration process, troops will receive their schedule of events, meal times and miscellaneous information regarding camp. Troops may share a building with other troops as well as the scheduled activities.

GSHPA Spotlight

Melanie Robison

"As far back as I can remember, Girl Scouts has challenged me to do things I never imagined I could." That's what GSHPA Volunteer and older-girl troop leader, Melanie Robison, of Schuylkill Haven, said when she was asked what drives her to stay involved with Girl Scouting.

Melanie was a Girl Scout for 12 years and has stayed active as a volunteer for 14 years since. She serves as the troop leader for two troops of both Cadette and Senior Girl Scouts in Service Unit 234. Melanie particularly enjoys working with the girls in these age ranges because she recalls that this was about the time when she really started to see how much Girl Scouting had an impact on her life.

Melanie does a lot of work with her troops to keep them active and interested in programming by planning a variety of different outdoor activities. "I think when girls reach the Cadette level, it can become challenging for volunteers and troop leaders to keep them engaged," Melanie said, "That is why I have really tried to impart to my troops that their experience is girl-led."

Her troops are very involved in the planning of their activities and programming. Melanie explained that it is a common practice for her to get her troops into a room at the beginning of the Girl Scout year, give them a white board and let them write down their ideas of what activities they'd like to do throughout the year. And then she gives them that extra push in the right direction to make sure the activities they've chosen will help them to develop important leadership skills, which will serve them later in their adult lives.

According to Melanie, if it wasn't for her leader pushing her, she may not have stayed involved with Girl Scouting and she certainly wouldn't have developed the valuable skills she has used to help her become a successful in her life and her career. "I was very fortunate as a girl to have a phenomenal leader who really pushed me and brought out the best in me," Melanie recalled, "She became like a second mother to me and allowed me to see that I had what it took to step up and be a leader."

Since Melanie has graduated from high school, she has found herself in leadership roles in one way or another and says she owes that to Girl Scouting. Those experiences are what fueled her desire to stay active as a volunteer and dedicated to helping today's older Girl Scouts find those important leadership qualities within themselves.

"As I bridged to adulthood, my experience as a girl scout made me realize that I wanted to provide that same type of leadership to girls," Melanie added, "I was lucky enough to have a great troop leader who helped me to see what I could become, and that propelled me to become a leader myself."

Around the Council

Girl Highlights

 Alyssa Lopez and Morgan Landers from Junior troop 50273 in Clarks Summit, SU 511, delivered approximately 400 lbs of food Monday night to the Abington Ecumenical Ministerium in Dalton, PA. They collected the food nearly three weeks for their Bronze Award.

- Girl Scout Daisy Troop 71370 from Friendly Valley Lancaster County participated in a food drive for the Leola Food Bank. Girls collected food from friends, family and neighbors. While delivering the items, girls learned about the food bank, how it works and who it serves. Soon after their initial visit, the troop returned to the food bank to help stock the shelves. The girls had a great time and earned their pink Daisy Petal for helping to make the world a better place through service and volunteering.
- On Tuesday, January 25, more than 60 Girl Scouts of all ages joined their peers and more than 500 coin collectors for the launch of the "America the Beautiful Quarter" at Gettysburg Military Park. Girls were invited to recite the Pledge of Allegiance during the opening flag ceremony and helped to entertain the growing crowd by singing camp songs until the Gettysburg High School War Ceremonial Brass Band began to play. The girls were given priority seating in front of the stage and treated as VIP's; they sat in awe as they listened to various speakers talk about historic objects from the Civil War era and how the battlefield preserves not only history, but is environmentally beneficial. Lincoln impersonator, James Getty, delivered the Gettysburg Address to the crowd as girls, who had memorized the famous speech in school, recited along. US Representative Todd Platts sent a spokesperson and the new first lady of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Susan Corbett, read our new governor's very first Proclamation. The girls were invited to pose for photos with Mrs. Corbett, who shared with the girls that she was a former Girl Scout and troop leader.
- Troop 41195 in Centre County visited the Boalsburg Fire Station to learn fire-safety techniques. The girls also got to meet with the town's firemen, try on some of their "Whoa, too heavy!" gear and sit in the trucks. The girls really enjoyed visiting with the firefighters and learning about the importance of fire safety.
- Girl Scout Troop 40349 in Mifflin County spent the Martin Luther King Holiday break from school doing community service at the SPCA Shelter in State College. The 18-member multi-age level troop spent the day learning about the animals and then helped with grooming of the cats and dogs and cleaning the shelter.

- Volunteers from Service Unit 175 (Middletown, Dauphin County) held a Day Off School event on Monday January 17, 2011. They had 40 girls attend. This program was open to girls that are registered and girls who are new to Girl Scouts. 10 girls that attended were not previously registered Girl Scouts and are now planning to join a troop. The theme was "Bring on the Drama." Girls transformed large paper into a costumes and used them in a skit, did role-playing with a partner, made a small directors board, mini microphones, and a small movie reel (made out of silver bottle caps with black electrical tape). The girls had a great time.
- Volunteers from Service Unit 163 (Duncannon/Marysville, Perry County) recently planned and held a Camporee at Small Valley. Nearly 60 girls and adults attended. Two girls who had grown up in Girl Scouts in the area and are now in college, also joined the group and acted as "counselors." The younger girls loved having them there! The weekend was filled with great food, songs, fun, crafts and other great activities. Many of the Brownies were on their first camping trip ever – and one was heard to say – "Is everyone coming back next year?" The weekend also gave the leaders time to brainstorm and pass information on from seasoned leaders to the rookies in the group.
- Service Unit 709-Donegal presented the first "Inspired Volunteer" award to long-time volunteer, Sheryl Smeal of Maytown (Lancaster County). Sheryl has been a Girl Scout volunteer for over 25 years, and has served in various leadership and service team positions. The service team created this award to recognize outstanding volunteers for their dedication and commitment to creating fun, girl-led Girl Scout experiences for girls in their community. The team plans to recognize one 'inspired leader' at each service unit meeting, as it is their hope that by honoring a volunteer each month, other volunteers will be inspired by their leadership and achievements.
