Julia Biechler

From Girl Scout Cookies to Olympic Gold-those are the aspirations of 12 year-old Julia Biechler, a Cadette from Hershey, PA. In December, 2010, Julia and her skating partner Alexander Petrov won the Juvenile Ice Dancing championships at the US Figure Skating Junior Nationals in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Julia, a member of Troop # 11039, has been skating since she was only two years old and a Girl Scout since she was a Daisy. Though skating is her true passion, Julia says that her experience as a Girl Scout has played an important role in her success on the ice. "Girl Scouts has really helped me learn how important it is to set goals and push myself to achieve them," Julia said.

Julia competes in both Freestyle skating and Ice Dancing and, she enjoys both. "I love Dance because it forces me to push myself to do harder routines and I love being lifted and floating across the ice," Julia added. "I also love Freestyle because it allows me to put more of myself into the routine." She has set a new goal for herself for next year is to make it to Junior Nationals for both categories of competition.

Being a Girl Scout has helped Julia to be more prepared for traveling across the country and meeting new people at national skating competitions. "It has just helped me to become a more well-rounded person and to realize that I don't have to be shy or afraid to talk to new people when I meet them."

It seems like there is no challenge too big for Julia, and she hopes to someday represent the United States as a Gold medal hopeful in the Olympics like her favorite Freestyle skater, Rachael Flatt and her favorite Ice Dancing team, Charlie White and Meryl Davis. But for now, her sights are set on her next goal of making it to the 2012 Junior National competition in California.

Property Reservation System Improvements in the Works

Time and time again we have heard concerns and frustrations from folks who have been trying to use our online property reservation system through E-Council to book a day, overnight or weekend visit to one or more of our seven camps. While the current online reservation system conveniently accepts credit card payments when you submit your reservation, we often find ourselves having to follow-up with folks after the fact to make multiple reservation changes because of the online system's limitations when it comes to avoiding overbooking or double-booking a specific unit or facility.

In the coming months, we plan to roll out an improved camp property reservation system. The improved system will still allow folks to submit reservation requests via email and/or our website, but will do a better job of confirming a unit(s) availability prior to accepting your security deposit. In the meantime, please hang in there and continue to use the E-Council Property module and look for more info about the improved process in future issues of this e-newsletter.

Financial Assistance Form has been Updated

Our council offers financial assistance for girls throughout all 30 of our counties who qualify. Often covering the costs or a percentage of the costs associated with troop dues, attending camp, participating in a council or service unit activity and/or trip, books and uniform components, financial assistance helps girls who would not otherwise be able to afford to participate take full advantage of all of the Girl Scout activities we offer. To help streamline the application process, we recently made some modifications to our financial assistance form. Bad Checks and Cookie Sales

All of our cookie training has reiterated the importance of not accepting checks from people whom girls and/or their parents don't know. Unfortunately, even those we may know can either knowingly or unknowingly pay for their cookies with a check or not have enough money in their account to cover their purchase(s). If this happens to a member of your troop or service unit, please contact your product sales associate to discuss the check recovery process that we now have in place to help protect our girls. While not a guarantee, this process, if successful, will help our innocent girls collect the unpaid amount and cover any bank fees associated with the transaction.

Please note that this process is not 100% guaranteed and should recovery prove to be impossible, your troop or service unit will still be responsible for both the missing money and the fees associated with the bounced check. Keep in mind that the best way to protect your troop or service unit is to discourage anyone from accepting checks as payment for any cookie purchases.

Around the Council

Girl Highlights

- More than 100 Girl Scouts from across Centre County and the West Region joined 200+ youth for a special sports clinic at Penn State University last Sunday afternoon in observance of National Girl and Women's Sports Day. The program afforded girls the opportunity to experience eight different Big Ten collegiate sports (soccer, lacrosse, volleyball, cheerleading, gymnastics, dance, softball and golf) with PSU team players assisting at each station. Following the clinic, the girls had the opportunity to watch the PSU Lady Lions basketball team defeat the nationally ranked Buckeyes of The Ohio State University.
- A Leader from Stroudsburg tells us about Jean, who is currently a freshman at East Stroudsburg University on a full academic scholarship. She continues to come to meetings weekly to help out with the younger girls and to have fun with the older girls, "Jean's mother died of breast cancer when Jean was in 2nd grade. Her teacher asked one of our leaders if Jean could join their troop because she thought it would help Jean. Jean has continued with Girl Scouts ever since. After Jean's mother died she was basically left to raise herself. Except for her good friend Rachel & Rachel's mom Dawn who made sure she continued to attend Girl scouts, do well in school, support her financially, etc. Last year Jean's dad died while in prison of a drug over dose which is still being investigated. Girl Scouts has remained a constant for Jean & I truly believe influenced her, supported her, and helped her rise above adversity."

Volunteer Highlights

- Volunteers from Mason Dixon Service Unit (834) in Franklin County recently planned and held a Science-themed event for Brownies, Juniors and teens called "Lighten Up," with all experiments centering around light. The girls would travel to 5 different stations with hands-on experiments including making their own telescope that they would take out and look at the night sky. Each station meets a requirement for a Try-It, badge, or IP.
- Christy Foltz, troop leader with Daisy Troop #70996, Millersville, recently shared her thoughts on attending her area service unit meetings: "As an assistant leader last year, I did not attend any of the Service Unit Meetings, as I didn't see a need for it. It was only after taking over the troop this year and attending the meetings; I realized I

missed out and regret not going to the meetings last year. They are concise and well run, and not only offer a wealth of information, but remind me that I am not alone as a new leader and have unlimited support."
