Celebrating Girl Scouts' Highest Honor

More than 80 girls from our Council were recognized on Saturday, June 25, 2011 for earning the coveted Girl Scout Gold Award during the 2011 GSHPA Gold Award Event at the National Civil War Museum in Harrisburg.

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest honor a Girl Scout can attain. By earning the Gold Award, a Girl Scout has demonstrated her special commitment to excellence in herself, her community and her future. Recipients must complete several activities covering career exploration, leadership skills, community service and specialized interest projects, followed by a comprehensive project

selected and designed by the recipient based on her skills and interests.

After months of working on their projects, all 83 recipients who earned the notable award between April 2010 and April 2011 were honored during the elegant luncheon. The event included the display of numerous Gold Award projects and a keynote address by newly-elected GSHPA Board member and Senior Vice President and Managing Director of Strategic Growth at Weston Solutions, Inc., Kathleen A. McGinty. GSHPA Board Chair Kate Crowley served as the event's MC.

During her address, McGinty praised each of the girls in attendance for the hard work and commitment they had demonstrated by earning their Gold Awards. "Each one of you is uniquely valuable, and I believe this is only the beginning of your journeys and the contributions you will make to your communities as leaders," McGinty added. "If you own your gold, it will give you the self confidence to recognize that everyone around you is also unique and has important skills to offer, which will help to make you all great leaders."

"It is truly an honor each year for us to recognize the girls who have worked so hard to achieve their goal of earning the Gold Award," said GSHPA President and CEO, Jane Ransom. "This event serves as a great reminder of what Girl Scouts is all about... helping today's girls become tomorrow's leaders."

More than 30 girls attended the event and members from each region of GSHPA's 30-county service area were represented. Each girl was also encouraged to invite troop leaders, family members and friends to help them celebrate their special day. Also honored at the event were the 12 girls from the council who received the 2011 GSHPA Scholarship Awards.

Purchasing Optional Activity Insurance Basics

An optional plan of activity insurance is available for Girl Scouts taking extended trips and for non-members who participate in Girl Scout activities. These plans are secondary insurance that individuals are entitled to receive while participating in any approved supervised Girl Scout activity. Optional insurance coverage is available for any Girl Scout activity that involves non-Girl Scouts or lasts longer than three days and two nights. This form must be submitted along with a check made payable to Girl Scouts in the Heart of PA at minimum of two weeks prior to the trip/event to:

The current rates are listed below per plan. Insurance rates should be calculated based on the period of time beginning with the day the participant leaves home through the day the participant returns home.

Plan 2: \$0.11 per day, per participant
Plan 3E: \$0.70 per day, per participant
Plan 3P: \$0.29 per day, per participant
Intl. Plan 3PI: \$1.17 per day, per participant

Gold Award Requirements Transition Reminder

It's finally here – the official cut-off point between the old ("Go For It – Gold Award") and the new (the "Gold Award Take Action" Journey) GSUSA guidelines for all Gold Award projects! September 30, 2011 is the official deadline for all girls who are in the process of completing their Gold Award projects under the "old" guidelines (also known as the "Go For It – Gold Award" guidelines). All girls who are working on projects with completion dates after September 30, 2011 should already know that they need to follow the new guidelines. Dates have been changed for the 52nd Girl Scouts National Convention

If you are interested in being an Official Visitor at the 52nd Girl Scouts National Convention in Houston, please be advised that the dates have been changed. The new dates for the event are **November 8 to November 13, 2011**. Individuals wishing to attend as full-time visitors must pay the convention registration fee and register to attend through GSHPA. Registrations and payments received by GSUSA before July 15 are \$225 for girls (ages 14-17) and \$295 for adults (18 and over). After July 15, the cost is \$275 for girls and \$350 for adults. All travel, lodging and eating expenses would be your responsibility. All Official Visitors registering to attend, including friends or family members of delegates, must be registered members

of GSUSA and be 14 years of age or older at the time of the convention.

- Troop #10645 (Cumberland County) recently held a clothing drive. They collected approximately 50 large bags full of items and increased their own and other's awareness of the need. The donations came from the girl's families and from throughout the service unit and local community. Although it took quite some time to load and unload all of the bags from the leaders' cars, the girls believe they had a great day and did something for a good cause.
- Troop #10554 in Carlisle submitted this awesome presentation of media messages they prepared to reach other teens about issues of concern to them. Click here to view.
- On Saturday, June 4th, 2011, Girl Scouts from service unit 310 (Tamaqua), took a trip to New York City to see the Broadway show Wicked. This in itself

was a once in a lifetime experience for many of the girls. Rachel Pailsey, a cadette from the service unit, had submitted a "For Good" project to the Broadway show committee and she was selected, along with two others who attended the show, to present her project on stage in front of the entire Broadway audience.

- Four Juniors from Troop #50273 from Clarks Summit collected 49 packages as part of their "Operation Care Package" Bronze Award project. The local VFW and the VFW from the Tobyhanna area all donated money to help with the shipping cost which was more than \$600. The "Friends of the Forgotten," an organization whose mission is to ensure that soldiers serving now are not forgotten, was so impressed with the amount of packages the girls collected, (they far exceeded their original goal of 15 packages) that they presented the girls with their Bronze Award at a special event. The "Friends of the Forgotten" have spearheaded the project of a memorial to the first woman killed in action in Vietnam – a local Dunmore nurse. In October, they will have a dedication which either President Obama or Vice President Biden will attend. Troop #50273 has received a special invitation and a request to be front and center.
- GSHPA staff in the Northeast Region gave back to the community in the 1st ever Truck Drop to benefit the United Neighbor Centers of NEPA. They braved downpours, high winds, and the extreme sun to show community support. Girls who came participated in activities from the It's Your Planet – Love It Journey and took home some valuable information and tools to make the world a better place.

Volunteers

Memories of last summer's day camp fun have not faded for Service Unit 841-Juliette Low. In keeping with the last year's day camp western theme, volunteer Monica Reese was asked to be the Pony Express rider, delivering important messages from camp directors (sheriffs) to Service Units and collecting attendance etc. to take back to them. Monica took this idea and literally ran with it, riding a stick horse from Service Unit to Service Unit, collecting messages in her authentic leather pouch. The girls were so charmed they began writing messages to girls in other Service Units, and

Monica's morning rounds could take up to two hours to fulfill. Months later at the service unit recognition dinner this spring Monica was awarded the Outstanding Volunteer award in appreciation of this and all the other great experiences she has created for the girls in Juliette Low Service Unit.

- Volunteers from Service Units 152 and 153 (Greater Carlisle area in Cumberland County) offered a wonderful experience to the girls of their communities. Approximately 100 girls from each Service Unit gathered recently at YMCA Camp Thompson near Pine Grove State Park for Great Beaver Adventure Camp. The girls are enjoyed hiking, making SWAPs, cooking out, and overnights for the Juniors and Cadettes. The theme for this year's camp was Wet and Wild and featured fun water-related activities like swimming in Lake Laurel, canoeing, and water games including a frozen t-shirt melt relay where teams competed with one another to see who could thaw their t-shirt the fastest and put it on!
- Endless Mountain and Mountain Ridge Service Units in Susquehanna County teamed up this year and challenged the troops to commit to 500 hours of community service throughout the year. They exceeded their goal and completed 739 hours. It is rumored that next year they are going for 1000!
