State Legislators Join Troop Pennsylvania

26 women from the Pennsylvania state legislature gathered at the State Capitol in Harrisburg on Tuesday, October 18, to help Pennsylvania's three Girl Scout councils generate excitement about the 100th Anniversary of Girl Scouting by becoming honorary members of Troop Pennsylvania.

Senator Pat Vance and Representative Jennifer Mann served as honorary troop leaders during an Investiture Ceremony on the rotunda steps.

"Yesterday, today and tomorrow, Girl Scouts inspires girls to reach their full potential by transforming today's girls into tomorrow's leaders. I know from my own direct experience– and especially from Girl Scout camp! —that Girl Scouts challenges girls to step outside their comfort zone, explore the world, and expand their horizons," said Senator Vance during her opening remarks.

The purpose of creating Troop PA is to begin a partnership in honor of the 100th Anniversary of Girl Scouts that links women members of the state legislature with Girl Scouts' mission of building girls of courage, confidence and character, who make the world a better place.

"With the Girl Scouts centennial year coming up, this is a great time to build our ties with the Girl Scouts, whose century-long experience and research in the business of leadership development for girls represents a wonderful resource as we go about the work of policy-making here in the state capitol," added Representative Mann.

First Lady Susan Corbett will serve as the Honorary Chair of the 100th Anniversary of Girl Scouting in Pennsylvania and was also in attendance at the event on October 18. "I know firsthand how Girl Scouting builds the confidence and leadership skills of girls," said the First Lady. "You see, as a former Girl Scout and troop leader, I've seen the magic of Girl Scouting in action."

"Girl Scouts have descended on the Capitol, on and off for decades, to express their concerns and ideas about issues that impact girls," said Jane Ransom, President and CEO of GSHPA. "As we turn the corner to the second century of Girl Scouting we hope to continue this tradition, as well as to serve as a resource for information and research as you, the members of Troop PA, partner with us to work on issues with significant impact on girls."

The partnership between Girl Scouts and the members of Troop PA will focus on four issues of particular interest: Promoting girls' physical, social and emotional health; Increasing girls involvement in science, technology, engineering and math; Girls and leadership; and Financial literacy.

"We are very excited about this partnership," Ransom added.

"As we embark on our 100th year, the members of Troop Pennsylvania will serve as exemplary role models for Girl Scouts across this great state."

Winning videos will be placed into a virtual time capsule at the GSHPA 100th Anniversary Camporee in August 2012 and left for Girl Scouts of 2112 to find 100 years from now. Updated with references to the New Girl's Guides to Girl Scouting and the latest Journey, new volunteers will now be asked to take Girl Scouting 101 within the first three months of their appointment via a simple link on our website. And for those volunteers with previous training, no need to panic, you're not required to take the updated training if you've previously completed the previous version called Leadership Essentials. • In October, Service Unit 645 had their Forever Green

- Girls from Junior Troop 12276 which meets at Mountain View Elementary in SU 178 (Dauphin County) were recently featured in a story in the Harrisburg Patriot-News during their meeting. The reporter was interested in seeing a troop meeting in action and learning about how Girl Scouts impacts the girls' lives as we approach the 100th anniversary of Girl Scouting. Nikki Kessler, the troop leader, said that the girls enjoyed the experience and were very comfortable with having the reporter at their meeting.

The girls planted cucumbers, radishes, tomatoes and other vegetables and took care of fertilizing, weeding and harvesting. They also helped prepared bread and other dishes to be served to the homeless population at the kitchen.

Saturday night featured a Sky Show in STAR Center and the weekend was capped off with a Girl Scouts Own ceremony, appropriately built around the theme of rain.
