# Cookie College/Rallies Go Council-Wide to Kick Off Cookie Season



Nearly 1,800 Girl Scouts from across our council kicked off the Girl Scout Cookie season for the 100<sup>th</sup> year of Girl Scouting by attending the Cookie Rally and Cookie College events held in each of our five regions.

"This year we combined the Cookie Rallies and Cookie Colleges into full-day, council run events and held them at locations in each of our five regions to make it easier for girls from all counties in our service area to attend and kick off this year's cookie sale," said Jane Ransom, GSHPA President and CEO.

The results of expanding the event were very positive. The Cookie Rallies were attended by 1,175 girls in grades K- 5. They participated in a variety of fun activities and learned about customer service and marketing techniques that will help them make this year's cookie sale a success.

And a total of 587 girls in grades 6-12 attended Cookie College and graduated as newly minted Cookie Entrepreneur Officers, armed with the tools and skills they will need as they create their very own cookie businesses. The girls participated in interactive workshops focusing on goal setting, social media and creative marketing tactics.

"These events are a great way to kick off the cookie sale season and help girls get excited and learn about the importance of the cookie program, especially as we begin celebrating our 100th year of Girl Scouting," Ransom added.

# Girls

When the girls in troop 60116 from 626 Service • Unit in Jersey Shore heard about the GSHPA's collection of Candy Bar Wrappers (for Forever Green initiative) they decided to go a step further and not only collect wrappers from their families, they also approached the principal at their school and asked him to make an announcement for everyone in the school to collect the wrappers. The principal agreed but felt the only way to be fair since more than one Girl Scout troop was located in the school they would have to share the collection with the other troops. The girls were happy to do so. They then asked their parents to do the same at their work places. Cathy Eisner, leader for the troop was so proud that the girls decided to do this all on their own and so far have

brought home several bags of candy wrappers. At the end of the collection, girls managed to have two 55 gallon bags full!

- On November 6th, Emily Creveling and Montana Drumheller received their Gold Award during a very emotional program where friends and family were in attendance. PA State Representative David Millard, Columbia County Commissioner David Kovach, and PA State Senator John Gordner were in attendance for the program. All spoke very highly of Girl Scouts and of the project that the girls completed. Senator Gordner spoke regarding the PA Honorary Troop that was inducted in Harrisburg and how wonderful it was for that to happen. Both girls are a part of the Bloomsburg service unit (303).
- Recently troop 61388 of Loyalsock was invited by Hillside Assisted Living to visit one of their newest residents—a woman who had been a Girl Scout many years ago and wanted to share her memories with the girls in the troop. The troop is planning on visiting her on a regular basis throughout the coming year for the 100th anniversary to discuss what Girl Scouts was like when she was a girl. They also plan on "adopted" her for Christmas. The leader is hoping this will be something the girls will be able to continue even after the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary is over.

## Volunteers

67 Daisy to Ambassadors girls and their leaders and helpers from Upper Dauphin County - participated in Service Unit 192's Forever Green Day held at Dauphin County Conservation District Office. The event was hosted by Troop 12339 with assistance by Kelly Wolf of Dauphin County Recycling Center. The girls joined in singing a song written about Forever Green, participated in stations about recycling and water pollution, the latter sponsored by the Penn State Cooperative Extension in Dauphin County. The girls also learned about Stream Teams - a way girls can help to improve the waters around their communities. Lastly the girls took a walk around the grounds with Mr. Gill to learn about Storm Water Management, learning how plants and trees are an important part of the storm water management plan. The day ended with

the girls receiving recycled water bottles and a pen made from recycled Styrofoam!

- On Friday, December 2, 84 girls and many adults of the Bloomsburg Service Unit went Christmas caroling along the main street of Bloomsburg. This yearly event is an exciting one for the Service Unit. Many businesses expect them to come every year and invite them into their stores where they often receive free tokens of appreciation (usually candy or cookies) for their festive singing. After caroling, the girls enjoy crafts and snacks at their local church.
- Volunteer Janice Musante, Troop Leader with Brownie Troop 71470 in SU711-Hempfield (Lancaster County) has been sending packages filled with amazing cards, beautiful pictures, and trinkets/toys generously donated by local Girl Scout Troops to her brother, Greg, who is stationed in Afghanistan. When Greg received the packages, he would place some of the cards for the soldiers under their Christmas Tree so they would find them when they returned from the field. He would also leave some of the cards with soldiers who were out in the field in remote areas when he did rescue missions. Greg stated that the soldiers are like little kids because they all swarm around him when a package arrives - they all HAVE to see what is inside and LOVE when they receive the cards. He has also given out the pictures and toys to the children (on the streets and in the Hospitals when he makes his rounds). He said even though there is such a big language barrier, the pictures and toys seem to say so much to them and bring a smile to their faces.
