Plans are well underway for the 100th Anniversary Camporee on August 10 – 12, 2012 at the York Expo Center. In addition to a variety of 100th Anniversary and Forever Green-themed activities, a kickball tournament to crown the council-wide champions in the younger and older girl categories and much, much more, GSHPA is pleased to announce that Radio Disney's Kicking Daisies will be visiting our council once again.



Greeted by almost 1,500 fans during their initial appearance at the Forever Green Kick-off event back in May 2011 (see photo above), the band is excited to make a repeat performance on the evening of Saturday, August 11 at the Camporee! Forever Green Updates Candy Wrapper Recycling Project a Huge Success

Thank you to all the girls and troops who came together to help GSHPA collect candy wrappers for our Every Wrapper Counts council-wide recycling effort. Thanks to your efforts, GSHPA collected more than 22 large boxes overflowing with individual candy wrappers, large candy bar wrappers, candy bags and multi-pack candy wrapping back to Terracycle.

Terracycle is a company that collects items we normally throw in the trash and finds ways to turn them into new products such as pencil cases, purses, and backpacks! "Back in October, 2011, we told our girls about this project and that every wrapper counts, and they took the challenge head on," said Lori McCracken," GSHPA Program Coordinator. "The girls saved their own candy wrappers, their friend's candy wrappers, some of them even set up candy wrapper collections in their schools."

GSHPA sent a total of 115 lbs. of candy wrappers back to Terracycle as a result of this initiative. With the average weight of one candy wrapper being .009 lbs., that adds up to a very substantial amount of recycled materials. Just take a look at the photo below for only a small amount of the wrappers we received from troops.



"We were thrilled with the enthusiasm our girls showed throughout this initiative," McCracken added.

Did you know...

That in 1917, Iona Paxson, a 12 year old girl in Schuylkill County worked together with the pastor at her church, St. Matthew's, to form the First Girl Scout Troop in Schuylkill County? She also partnered with a local steel mill to have 100 Girl Scout medals for members of Girl Scouts and the St. Matthew's. The last medal was given to the Jeannie Johns, daughter of Girl Scout Volunteer, Pat Johns in 1968 by Iona herself.

Application Deadline for GSHPA College Scholarships Quickly Approaching

Girl Scouts in the Heart in Pennsylvania will once again offer a number of \$500 - \$1,000 scholarships for eligible girl members who are currently seniors in high school. To apply, interested girls should complete and submit a complete application by logging onto

<u>www.gshpa.org/girls/scholarships.html</u>. The deadline to apply is March 30, 2012.

Scholarships will be awarded to applicants who meet the criteria listed for each of the following categories:

Gold Award Scholarship:

- Gold Award Recipient required
- Graduating Senior who will attend an institute of higher education – either college or technical school qualifies
- Academic excellence
- Strong commitment to community service activities

Schuylkill County Scholarship:

 Schuylkill County graduating senior who will attend an institute of higher education - either college or technical school qualifies

- Active participant in Girl Scouts
- Academic excellence
- Strong commitment to community service activities

Graduating Senior Scholarship Criteria:

- Graduating senior who will attend an institute of higher education either college or technical school qualifies
- Academic excellence
- Strong commitment to community service activities
- Active participation in Girl Scouts

In addition to these local scholarships, graduating Girl Scouts are also eligible for scholarships across the nation. Please also encourage girls to check the GSUSA Web site for a complete listing of scholarship opportunities.

Encourage Your Girls to Become Camp Counselors!

Do you know a girl who is in 10th, 11th or 12th grade and is interested in becoming a camp counselor? You should encourage her to enroll in one of GSHPA's Counselor in Training (CIT) Programs. Our CIT programs help 10th, 11th and 12th grade girls transition from campers to counselors, offering them the opportunity to hone their skills by challenging themselves with new responsibilities.

For consideration into the CIT I or II Program, girls should submit a CIT Registration form and Program application by April 30, 2012. Girls are only eligible for the CIT II program if they have already completed the CIT I program.
