# Trainings Available for Volunteers to Lead Backpacking Programs This Spring

This Spring GSHPA is introducing our newest outdoor program – Backpacking! We will offer two introductory backpacking programs for girls in the Junior to Ambassador grade levels, and we are looking for volunteers to help lead these exciting new outdoor experience programs.

If you are passionate about the outdoors and camping with Girl Scouts, then we need you to sign up for this Wilderness Leadership Training and help us introduce this new council-run program to our girls.

The weekend-long training will be held on Friday, March 23 at 6 pm to Sunday, March 25 at 5 pm at Camp Small Valley in Halifax, PA, and workshops will include:

- Leave No Trace
- Backpacking meals
- Water filtration
- Clothing
- Packing a backpack and more

Upon completion of this training, participants will be equipped with the knowledge they need to lead independent Girl Scouts or a few members of a troop on backpacking trips.

GSHPA will provide tents, food and cooking equipment for all volunteers who attend the training weekend.

Anyone interested in participating should be able to carry a backpack weighing up to 35-40 lbs and hike a minimum of 3-5 miles.

Only volunteers who have completed Basic Outdoor Skills Training and are certified in First Aid and CPR are eligible for the backpacking training course.

## Did you know?

Girl Scout Cookies<sup>®</sup> had their earliest beginnings in the kitchens and ovens of our girl members, with mothers volunteering as technical advisers and that the sale of cookies as a way to finance troop activities dates back to as early as 1917, just five years after Juliette Gordon Low started Girl Scouting in the United States. The earliest mention of a cookie sale found to date was that of the Mistletoe Troop in Muskogee, Oklahoma, which baked cookies and sold them in its high school cafeteria as a service project in December 1917. In the 1920s and 1930s, Girl Scouts in different parts of the country continued to bake their own simple sugar cookies with their mothers. These cookies were packaged in wax paper bags, sealed with a sticker, and sold door to door for 25 to 35 cents per dozen.

## Girls

Also, they have been talking with those they know and members of the community about animal cruelty in hopes that education will help prevent it. They also visited the local S.P.C.A and got a tour of the facility, asked questions and learned more about supporting animals.

This project is part of a series of activities area troops are completing to provide support to community organizations throughout the centennial year. - Fifteen girls participated for the first time in the after school Defy the Odds program at Schuylkill Haven Elementary on Tuesday, Feb.
  Two girls were in the program last year and returned again this year. The girls worked on projects related to the *It's Your Story Tell It!* Journey, opening with passport and very important person name tags, acting portfolios and travel cases, made Girl Scout Law bracelets, and lastly came together to brainstorm all kinds of great ideas for things they would like to do over the next seven weeks.
- More than 100 Girl Scouts from Service Unit 417 in Centre County participated in a troop organized World Thinking Day program earlier this month. Troop 41205, with help from several other troops, designed a fun-filled morning centered on the theme "We Can Save Our Planet." Activities included singing, crafts, games and a bake sale. Each troop selected an activity or craft and created a colorful display to represent their country of choice. Each Girl Scout also participated in the Take Action project by writing letters to support to our

service men and women serving overseas.

## Volunteers

- With support from their Service Unit minigrant, Pocono Service Unit (504) celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Girl Scouts on Saturday, Feb. 4th at the North Pocono Middle School. While Girl Scout songs played in the background, those in attendance were able to visit displays based on the decades of Girl Scouts. Everyone was able to sample cookies made from the original Girl Scout Cookie recipe and were able to view a power point of Girl Scout history. - On Saturday, February 11, adults from Service Unit 221 (North Hills, South Central Region) observed Thinking Day by sharing about their Girl Scouting memories and experiences from the past. The adult Scouts had stories, memorabilia, and crafts to share with the girls of all ages in attendance. Valerie Pritchett, news anchor from ABC27 in Harrisburg shared her experiences with the girls, including how much the cookie sales had taught her. The troops also heard greetings from First Lady Susan Corbett. In addition to the stations, there were uniforms from yesteryear available.
- Volunteers in the South Region have been busy finalizing their plans with their service units and troops/groups to participate in the upcoming South Region Girl Scout Week Blitz. The blitz will kick-off on Sunday, March 11 and end on Saturday, March 17. Each day during the blitz week, girls and adults will express their Girl Scout spirit and pride through different themed activities. The goal of the blitz week is to have as many of the 7,000+ girl members, 3,000+ adult members, 600+ troops and 24 service units in the south region working to increase our visibility in Lancaster, York and Adams Counties. The Blitz Toolkit, which is

designed to help volunteers/girls plan their participation, is attached to this e-mail message.

## Take the ToGetHerThere Pledge

After nearly a year of frenzied preparation, GSUSA launched ToGetHerThere, the largest, boldest advocacy and fundraising cause campaign dedicated to girls' leadership in our nation's history. The launch took place at TimesCenter, the public event forum in the headquarters of the New York Times, on Tuesday, January 31, 2012. The near-capacity crowd included New York City dignitaries, representatives of the media, and the general public, along with GSUSA staff members, dozens of Girl Scouts from councils in and around New York City, and CEOs and other representatives of councils across the country.

"We are here," said GSUSA Chief Executive Officer Anna Maria Chávez, "to proclaim 2012 as the Year of the Girl and to renew the promise that the Girl Scout Movement has made to every girl, now for a full century. To all the girls in the audience, know that leadership is your birthright. We promise to help you discover opportunities to use your brilliance, your concern, and your compassion to make yourself a powerful leader-and our world a better place." Following the keynote address, a panel, moderated by Deborah Roberts of ABC News, discussed the findings of a recent GSUSA-sponsored research report on girls and the barriers they see standing between themselves and positions of leadership. Panelists included GSUSA National President Connie Lindsey; Jean Chatzky, bestselling personal finance author and correspondent for the Today show; Michelle Kwan, US public diplomacy envoy and former Olympic figure-skating champion; Joanna Coles, editor-in-chief, Marie Claire; Linda Descano, president and COO, Women & Co., a division of Citi (and also a member of GSUSA's National Board of Directors); and Kristen Sanchez, deputy managing partner, markets & offerings, Deloitte LLP.

The next day, in Washington, more than 450 nonprofit leaders, key business and community stakeholders, congressional staffers, and more than 25 members of Congress joined with GSUSA in the Cannon Caucus Room in the Capitol Building for a bipartisan event to support ToGetHerThere and the cause of attaining gender-balanced leadership in the United States. Secretary of Health and Human Services Kathleen Sebelius, House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D-CA), Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison (R-TX), Representative Shelley Moore Capito (R-WV), Representative Donna Edwards (D-MD), Senator Barbara Mikulski (D-MD), and Representative Loretta Sanchez (D-CA) spoke in support of Girl Scouts and ToGetHerThere.
